We collect, test, reuse and recycle Waste of Electrical and Electronic Equipment (WEEE). The collected equipment is either refurbished to be donated to schools in disadvantaged communities or turned into secondary raw materials.



WEEE management is a legal responsibility that all companies and public institutions have, and Ateliere Fără Frontiere is one of the organisations authorised by the National Agency for the Environment according to Law no. 211/2011 regarding the waste regime and Government's Ordinance no. 5/2015 for all operations of collection, transport, treatment, and preparation for the reuse of non-hazardous WEEE. The collected IT equipment is tested and, if it can be reused, it is repaired and cleaned and then delivered to the schools that need it most. When the equipment cannot be reused, it is disassembled for the recycling of raw materials (metal, plastic, glass), in compliance with the WEEE legislation in effect.

EduClick – computer donation programmes in support of education

Data from the National Institute of Statistics from 2018 showed that the 1.7 million children enrolled in primary and secondary education have access to only 136,365 computers in their schools - the lowest ratio in the European Union. In these school cycles, there is a computer for every

12 children on average and one for every 20 children in rural areas.

The digital divide remains high in Romania. For this reason, Ateliere Fără Frontiere donates thousands of computers each year, all refurbished in the reconect workshop for the social and professional integration of the disadvantaged. These donations made to schools, organisations and social institutions active in disadvantaged areas are possible with the support of our sponsors, and they advance education, social integration and vocational training projects where the need is the greatest.

THE SOCIAL AND PROFESSIONAL SCHEME FOR WORK INTEGRATION proposed by Ateliere Fără Frontiere is a personalised social activation service for people in great difficulty aiming at personal and social stability but also at (re)building sustainable employability. The standard programme lasts 24 months, to which can be added 12 months divided into 3 stages, if the person faces more severe difficulties.

At the end of the social and professional scheme for work integration offered by Ateliere Fără Frontiere, vulnerable people are supported to join the conventional labour market or protected forms of employment.

SOCIAL + CIRCULAR + SOLIDARITY ECONOMY



We collect outdoor advertising waste (PVC banner and mesh) and turn them into bags, wallets, pouches and other promotional accessories that are ethical, useful and highly customisable, mostly for corporate events.



remesh is a project born in 2011 in response to a social problem. In Romania, there are no recycling solutions to protect the environment from outdoor advertising materials after the campaigns they were created for end. OOH advertising campaigns have a life span of only a few days or weeks, and their number is very high. Thus, at the end of an advertising campaign, the used mesh prints and banners become trash to be sent to the landfills, polluting and contributing to climate change.



Through the **remesh** workshop, we turn these advertising banners into unique, ethical and useful products, that carry a message of responsible consumption and respect for both people and the environment.





At the Bio&Co farm in Ciocănari, Dâmbovița County, member of Réseau Cocagne France, we cultivate over 80 varieties of vegetables on four organic agriculture certified hectares of land, of

which 4000 m² represent greenhouses. The vegetables are distributed through a short supply chain, directly to subscribers, in weekly baskets delivered to their office or delivery pick-up locations in Bucharest.

The Bio&Co workshop is a complex project that contains three additional components serving the environment and people:

- a programme to combat food waste by collecting unsold foods (Carrefour) and restaurant meal scraps (Accor Hotels), sorting them to be donated or to enter compost production
- * a food solidarity programme in partnership with the Social Assistance Services of the Municipality of Bucharest (DGASMB) for the beneficiaries of the social canteen "Ominis" and those of the "Theodor Pallady" centre
- a pedagogical project (under development with the help of volunteers from partner companies) to raise awareness among students and the general public about the importance of sustainable agriculture, healthy eating and conserving biodiversity, local and responsible consumption, the circular economy

WORK INTEGRATION



The Ateliere Fără Frontiere (Workshops Without Borders) Association is a Romanian non-profit organisation founded in 2008 for the social, professional and civic integration of vulnerable, excluded and marginalised people.

Social benefits (allowances, financial aid) and passive social services are meant to stabilise the person in difficulty. The problem is that, in Romania, there are no integrated services for activating the vulnerable people who are physically able to join the labour market, which would combine the passive assistance system with one of social and professional support for integration, thus these people are left out of any effective reintegration system.

Work integration is the key to this challenge. In most EU countries, there are public policies that implement this methodology for the activation of people excluded from the labour market. Ateliere Fără Frontiere has created 3 work integration enterprises based on these principles, which offer:

- job placement with an employment contract and a salary, to give beneficiaries access to more rights, to rehabilitate them and help them learn work-related skills
- personalised services for social support, counselling for integration, psychotherapy and pedagogical accompaniment for skill building

The beneficiaries of the social and professional support services employed in these work integration social enterprises are people who accumulate multiple difficulties:

1. No professional project	8. Long-term unemployment

On average, an AFF employee in the work integration programme deals with **7.4 difficulties**.

The beneficiaries are selected based on their motivation to work and make life changes. These people arrive at AFF, through our partners - public institutions and NGOs providing medical-psycho-social services - when they cannot be activated only by training, vocational counselling, professional orientation or direct placement on the labour market. They need an integrated socio-professional accompaniment and job placement, before joining the conventional labour market.
